Glossary:

Darwin's Delights

Curiosity: a strong desire to know or learn something.

Endangered: (of a species) seriously at risk of extinction.

Artificial: made or produced by human beings rather than occurring naturally, especially as a copy of something natural.

Evolution: the process by which different kinds of living organism are believed to have developed from earlier forms during the history of the earth.

Variation: a change or slight difference in condition, amount, or level, typically within certain limits.

Inherit: derive (a quality, characteristic, or predisposition) genetically from one's parents or ancestors.

Selection: a process in which environmental or genetic influences determine which types of organism thrive better than others, regarded as a factor in evolution.

Specimen: an individual animal, plant, piece of a mineral, etc. used as an example of its species or type for scientific study or display.

Survival: the state or fact of continuing to live or exist, typically in spite of an accident, ordeal, or difficult circumstances.

Galapagos Islands: The islands are known for their large number of endemic species and were studied by Charles Darwin during the second voyage of HMS Beagle. His observations and collections contributed to the inception of Darwin's theory of evolution by means of natural selection.
