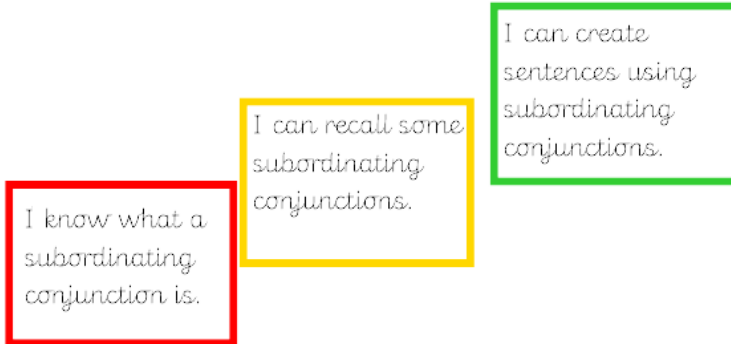

TBQ: Can I use subordinating conjunctions?



Subordinating conjunctions are words used in complex sentences.

Complex sentences have 2 or more clauses (parts). One part makes sense on its own but the other doesn't.

We use the subordinating conjunctions to join the parts of the sentence together.

if

when

that

I am making some toast **because** it's tasty.

I will have some pudding **when** I have finished my dinner.

I will wear the t-shirt **that** I got yesterday.

You can wear my coat **if** it starts raining.

If it starts to rain, you can wear my coat.

^ Some conjunctions can go at the start of your sentence.
